We begin the month with **All Saints' Day** which we shall observe on Sunday, November 3rd. This major Feast Day of the church recalls all of the saints who have gone before us and their examples of Godly living. Saint of the Month: Saint Cecilia

This month's featured Saint is Cecilia whose date is November 22nd. Saint Cecilia (Latin: Sancta Caecilia) is the patron saint of musicians. It is written that as the musicians played at her wedding, so she "sang in her heart to the Lord." She was a noble lady of Rome who, with her husband Valerian, his brother Tiburtius, and a Roman soldier Maximus, suffered martyrdom in about 230 A.D., under the Emperor Alexander Severus. After being struck three times on the neck with a sword, she lived for three days, and asked the pope to convert her home into a church. A church was constructed at that site in the fourth century; her remains were placed there in the ninth century, and the church was rebuilt in 1599.

When the Roman Catholic Academy of Music was founded at Rome (1584), she was made patroness of the institute, where upon her veneration as patroness of church musicians became universal. Today Caecilian musical associations and societies are widespread. The pipe organ is her saints' symbol and appears near her on icons and other religious art.
